- Different fields tend to be dominated by one mode

The role of Metaphors

- Our ordinary conceptual system... is fundamentally metaphorical in nature (Lakoff and Johnson 1980)
- Sfard metaphors are "the most primitive, most elusive, and yet amazingly informative objects of analysis."
- Shape our language and thinking in fundamental ways but often remain hidden until coaxed into view.
- Not just for the poets...

How metaphors work



Metaphors have power

- Mapping from source to target domain
- Generative metaphor dialogue between both elements
- Botha (2009) "in a metaphor an interaction takes place between two semantic fields. This leads to the creation of a novel meaning."
- Metaphor shapes solution crime as disease or monster (Thibodeau, McClelland and Boroditsky 2009)

The online pivot

- Nearly all education shifted online
- Ed Tech moved central stage
- Revealed ignorance about online ed
- Eg: 'The main reason why the "distance learning revolution" didn't replace the traditional model is that online learning just isn't as good.' (Laporte and Cassuto 2020)
- Lecture deficit model
- Reveals lack of alternative models

VAR and learning analytics

- Video Assisted Referee
- Inevitable and desired implementation of tech
- Minute measurements to messy human enterprise
- Relocates controversy
- Doesn't fix problems
- Undermines humans

• LA – needs to be implemented sympathetically



Cellini's Perseus

- An example of a new technique allowing new creation
- Medusa often a symbol of misogyny
- New approaches can replicate existing power structures
- Open source communities often male dominated
- Open labour often unrewarded

The VLE is a...

- Straitjacket –VLE is seen as constraining the educator
- Behemoth constraints arise from the nature of VLE 'industry' and associated process
- Digital Carpark –VLE is characterised as a repository or content-dump
- Safe Space –VLEs provide a supportive environment, such as 'security blanket'
- Smorgasbord –VLEs offer a wide variety of choice in terms of functionality
- Pathfinder –VLEs act as a pioneer for further technology and practices, an example being Trojan Horse metaphors.

Educator as DJ

- Finds useful segments
- Samples elements
- Remixes into something new
- Adds human element to music
- Educator in a content abundant network?

The Rebecca Riots



- Protests and disturbances in southwest Wales in the period 1839–1844
- Centred on toll gates, where anyone passing by had to pay a toll to use the road
- Symbolic of other grievances
- Academic publishing

Back

- Greedy Toll owners, absent & detached = publishers?
- Farmers in worsening context = academics?
- SciHub, #ICanHazPDF, Open access alternatives



Digital mudlarking

- Ed tech is an unclear field/discipline
- People enter it from different areas
- Rapid changes
- Historical amnesia
- Akin to mudlarking
- Tides leave behind artefacts
- Need to recognize and salvage good stuff before next tide

Uber for education

- Or Netflix for learning. Or AirBnB for education...
- Tied up with unbundling
- Ignore usually awful labor practices/business models
- Ignore why X is NOT like education:
 - Requires a long-time frame
 - It is very diverse, both geographically and by discipline
 - Being licensed to offer formal credit for learning is a complex highly regulated process.
 - Meno's paradox
 - Learning is often a social activity
 - Education is already engaging with online learning and mobile delivery





Jaws and the online pivot

- The shark is the virus Exposes existing frailties:
- "Those beaches will be open on the 4th July"
- Brody = learners; Hooper = educators; Quint = commerce
- Who will return from the fishing trip?
- "Just when you thought it was safe to go back to campus..."

Dangers of metaphors

- Powerful
- Often unnoticed
- Can exclude
- Imperfect
- Could find opposite one
